

Same Website New Look

CVE to Use Automated Calls

Central Valley Electric Cooperative has software that allows us to send automated voice messages and email to your phone.



We will use this system to send you important messages about the co-op and your account. Like past-due accounts, 48-hour disconnect notices, planned outages, and special projects that may be underway in your area. We will also send messages about upcoming events, like our annual meeting.

If you receive an automated voice message about your bill, at the end of the message, you will have the option to "Pay Now" and you will be transferred to a secure line where you can make a payment.

Rest assured that you can always call our office at 575-746-3571, and a live customer service representative will answer the call and assist you.

NEED MONEY FOR COLLEGE? The Central Valley Electric Education Foundation can help.



We are now accepting applications for college scholarships. Scholarships can be awarded to Central Valley Electric Cooperative members and their dependents.

Recipients can receive assistance for up to eight semesters of undergraduate studies. Students must reapply for the scholarship every year. Scholarship recipients can attend any accredited College, University or Trade School, must be considered a full-time student taking at least 12 credit hours, and maintain at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
